## PROGRESS NICE



The birth of NICE was driven by Highland Council desire to sell off Nairn's Town Centre Parking areas and derelict buildings to the highest bidders. NICE has now developed into a Community Body with the 'Right to Buy'.

Since its creation, NICE has been a key player in achieving the demolition of the Old Community Centre and Petrol Station, getting the Old Regal Bar smartened up, Safeguarding the Links School and the retention of the old Social Work building. After public consultation, NICE has produced a range of options for the redevelopment of the Town Centre and has now focused its attention on the redevelopment of the Old Social Work Building and is currently in discussion with the Council about its long term future.

NICE is run by a group of volunteer unpaid directors who are appointed by the members of the company.
